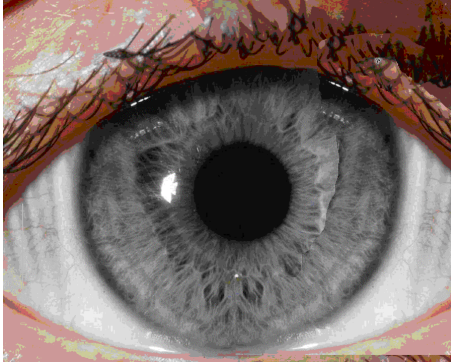


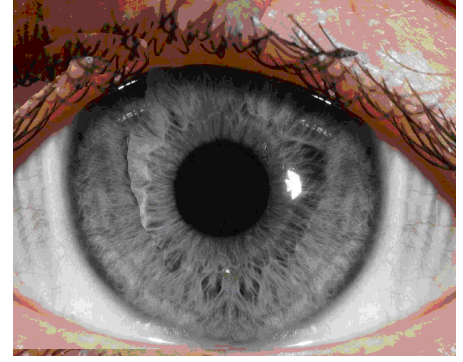

## Preventing Eye Injuries



Over the last ten years, PestSure employees have experienced 217 eye injuries costing almost \$300,000. Eye injuries are preventable.

You only have two eyes. Often damage to the eyes is irreversible. Loss of an eye to carelessness is needless.

From the moment you step out of the vehicle you should put on safety glasses or goggles. Often, eye injuries occur while preparing to do a treatment, inspection or during clean up after the job is completed.

Many eye injuries occur while unfolding a ladder after coming down from an attic or other elevated area. Debris is picked up on the bottom of your shoes and left on the top of the ladder. When the ladder is folded up, the debris falls off the ladder into your eyes.

While mixing chemicals, a small amount splashes in your eyes. While inspecting under the house or attic, dust is stirred up and gets in your eyes. Many events performed by technicians can cause eye injuries.

Some states now require pest management technicians to wear safety glasses, along with other personal protective equipment, every time you get out of the vehicle to do a treatment.

**Get a pair of safety glasses and wear them.**
