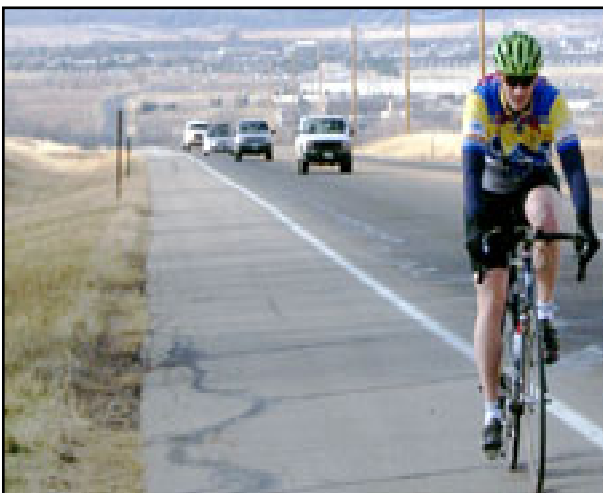
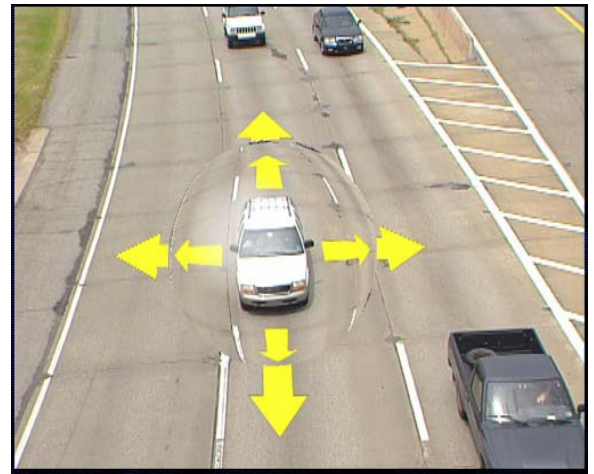

## Adjust to What You See

**Eos:** The **SAFE** Driver Improvement System™ teaches us many techniques for protecting yourself from the mistakes of others on the roadway. This year, we are reviewing some of the core techniques taught in Eos in the distribution of these monthly safety tips.

The second of the four key positive activities taught in Eos is “Adjust to What You See”. The key to defending yourself from the mistakes of others while driving is to develop our skills to be able to adjust for the errors that other drivers make. Consider the following as you attempt to develop your driving skills and incorporate this positive activity.

- Open up all six sides of your vehicle by keeping adequate space to the front, back, and sides and by being aware of clearance above and below your vehicle
- Form a “bubble” around your vehicle by re-establishing your space in traffic when another vehicle invades that space
- Use your space to identify and adjust for the errors of other drivers



Remember, there are many people driving on the roadway who have not received any training beyond what they received around age 16 when they were given a drivers license. These drivers are often distracted and really have no plan at all for how they drive. We, as **SAFE** drivers need to adjust for the continual errors going on around us thereby defending ourselves from these errors. By keeping our space in traffic and adjusting to the mistakes of others, our safe arrival at our destination will depend more on skill, and less on luck.
